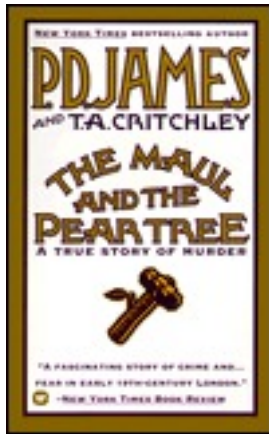

Description

The scene is the London Docks near Wapping Old Stairs, a sinister neighborhood where pirates were often hanged. The first victims were two hardworking shopkeepers, along with their baby and shop boy. Twelve days later and only a few blocks away, an equally blameless pub owner was found together with his wife and servant, victims of equal cruelty and apparent absence of motive. The serial killings provoked nationwide notoriety and panic. With the atmosphere and pacing of her best novels, James reveals the rudimentary police system of Regency London coping with a major murder investigation -- and crimes that rank up there with Jack the Ripper, the Boston Strangler, and Son of Sam as the very symbol of murderous and unthinking brutality.

Nancy: The website Spitalfields Life led me to *The Maul and the Pear Tree*, a book P.D. James wrote with T.A. Critchley.

Two families, Marr and Williamson, were murdered within days of each other in 1811 in their homes on Ratcliffe Highway. James and Critchley examine the crimes, how such crimes were investigated in the early 1800s in London and whether or not the suspect charged with the murders was guilty or not.

It hardly seemed those investigating the murders were knowledgeable enough for the job. There was a night watch, but it was made up of unarmed retired men in need of jobs. All the watch had were rattles to summon help and lanterns to help them through the dark streets. After these murders, the methods of guarding neighborhoods were changed.

Forensic science was a very cursory thing and little was made of weapons and clothing tracked or found at the scene. James and Critchley make a case for the man who died for the murders.

Michele: This is the third book I have read pertaining to these murders. I started with a fiction book loosely based on the murders, then I read DeQuincey's historical writings. This is a true-crime version and was by far the most factual account. It was well-researched and well-written and when the authors injected personal opinions they were clearly identified and supported with sound reasoning. Very interesting is the story of the justice system in 1811 England. The police force was just forming (or "not quite forming" perhaps) and the justice system was absolutely dysfunctional. I had just learned (in a philosophy course) of the debate between "saving the phenomena" versus aiming to "tell the truth." This was told in the context of early astronomy where initially, the goal was to provide an explanation of what was seen in the heavens, without caring whether or not this explanation was true, or even likely to be true. As I read this book, the comparison seemed very fitting. Initial investigation into the murder was motivated by one goal: calming the mob and giving the impression to the people that the job was being done and the people were being protected. (After all, this was a very brutal set of murders that even included a 3-month old victim) This led to the imprisonment of people who otherwise would not have been involved. "Someone said they saw a tall man running from the scene..." "He is tall" "He

can conceivably run" "He should be in jail." The theme of "Saving the phenomena" continues throughout the book. The authors provide a good accounting of the flawed investigation at the end which drives this point home. It mattered most that appearances were saved, not whether the actual murderer was identified. Some of the flawed logic is so glaring that the only possible explanation is that they simply did not care - all that mattered was that this story got wrapped up and provided some form of explanation/closure to the terror.

One last point of interest for me was the ritual of parading and burying the perceived murderer (who died in a prison cell prior to trial - deemed a suicide and therefore an admission of guilt at the time). The ritual is rife with superstition. The final burial place was at a main crossroads and this was in case the murderer returned after death (even though a stake had been driven through his heart and his limbs broken); faced with a crossroads, they reasoned, he would not know which road to take to seek his revenge.

Fear and Ignorance in 1811 England were very big factors in the behavior of the people and the society.

Debra: In December 1811, about sixty-five years before Jack the Ripper, another killer ran amuck in East London, killing seven people involving two families (one a three-month-old baby) along the Ratcliffe Highway. The highway was not the unpopulated thoroughfare we think of today, but a crowded street near the Thames filled with public houses, shops, and dilapidated houses catering to transient sailors. The crimes terrified people for their brutality and boldness, and authorities were pressured to find the culprit(s). As authors P.D. James and T.A. Critchley reveal in this book, law enforcement was horribly unskilled and incompetent in those days.

P.D. James's talent for detail in this nonfiction narrative vividly portrays life on Ratcliffe Highway. She also provides a clear, analytical presentation of evidence to depict what she and Critchley believe is the truth about the killers(s) identity. At times, the amount of detail and background was almost too much to wade through, and I was tempted to skip through it to get back to the main story. Yet, James portrays a time when prejudice against the Irish ran rampant and people could be arrested, tried, and convicted on flimsy evidence by today's standards. Was the wrong man convicted? Read the book. It's a fascinating story that will have you shaking your head.
